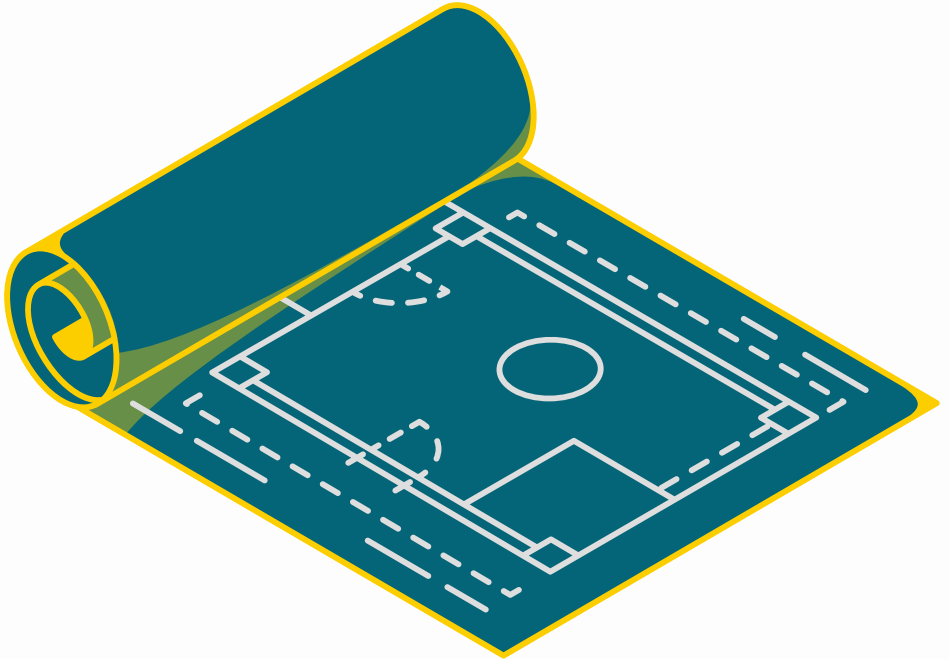

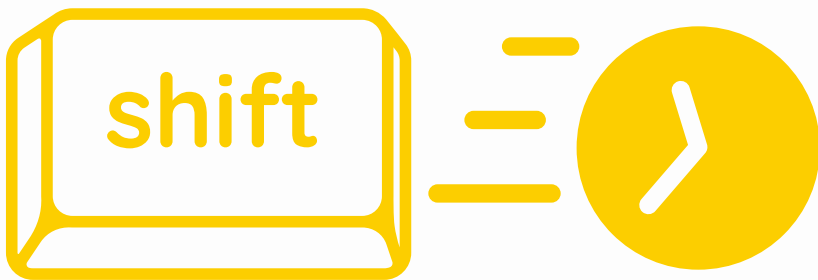
Now We Act!

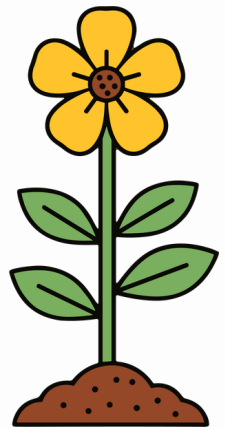
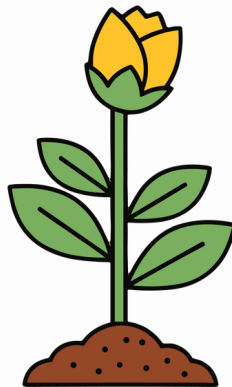
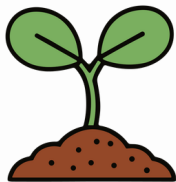
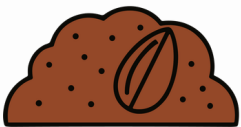
Support one local effort
